Homework expectations for Term 4:

Maths - Tasks on MyMaths will be set weekly to correspond with the learning in class.

Spelling - Weekly spelling lists will continue to be set on a Friday to be tested the following Friday. (A copy of these will be shared on Class Dojo each week).

Homework Menu - Throughout the term, I would like children to complete as many tasks from the 'Homework Menu' as they would like. These tasks relate to our topics in class and give the children the opportunity to develop their learning and understanding further. A minimum of one task should be completed from this menu.

Additional tasks - To support the preparation and transition to secondary school, additional tasks will be set throughout the term. This could be a grammar task or reading comprehension task.

Science: Animals including Humans

- Research and create a poster about your favourite animal.
- Reflect on what things you could do at different ages.
- Create a timeline of human life. What is different at each stage?
- Have a go at creating a word search or crossword which shows your understanding of key vocabulary and facts.
- Create a graph to show the gestation periods of different animals. What patterns do you notice?

Geography: Frozen Kingdoms

- Imagine that Earth has entered another Ice Age. Write a diary-style piece describing the changes and how the human race has adapted to cope.
- Find out what natural resources and raw materials are taken from the Arctic. What impact does this have on the environment?
- Design and write a postcard to share your "experience" visiting somewhere in the Polar regions.
- Make an 'Arctic Survival' instruction guide. Include pictures and diagrams of all the clothing and equipment that you would need to survive the extreme temperatures and stay alive.

Creative curriculum

- Create a model of an iceberg. Can you find out some facts about icebergs?
- Make a model of your favourite Arctic animal using clay, dough or recycled materials.
- Create your own Arctic and Antarctic word search puzzles using all the vocabulary you have learned during our topic. Challenge a grown-up to solve it!
- Design and build an igloo (on a small scale!)
