



# Homework expectations for Term 1:

Maths - Tasks on MyMaths will be set weekly (Friday) to correspond with the learning in class.

Spelling - Weekly spelling lists will be set on a Friday to be tested the following Friday. (A copy of these will be shared on Class Dojo each week).

Homework Menu - Throughout the term, I would like children to complete as many tasks from the 'Homework Menu' as they would like. These tasks relate to our topics in class and give the children the opportunity to develop their learning and understanding further. A minimum of one task should be completed from this menu.

Additional tasks - To support the preparation and transition to secondary school, additional tasks could be set throughout the term.

#### Homework Menu

Choose at least one task from the menu to complete before the end of term. You may have other creative ideas relating to our topic.

### Science: Earth and Space

- Draw a picture of the moon every night and report on how it changes shape and colour
- Create a timeline to show the history of space travel.
- Write a poem about a planet or something found in the solar system.
- Make your own space themed 'Top Trump' cards.
- Research some of the space missions. Consider what it would be like to have been involved in the missions.

## History: What does the census tell us about our local area?

- Visit the museum in Faversham. What interesting things can you find out? Display the facts in your own creative way.
- Create a fact file about someone significant in Faversham, or Kent. What did they do? What is their legacy?
- Create your own census. This could be family and friends local to you. Think about what information you should collect.
- Find out what life was like as a child in Faversham in a specific time period. Write a diary describing your experiences.

### Creative curriculum

- Create a model of the solar system (not to scale!)
- Make a space picture. You could paint, draw or use recycled materials.
- Find out about the artist Teis Albers. What do you notice about his work? Can you create something in his style?
- Design a new logo. This could be for the school or the local council.
- Build a sculpture of a local landmark using any material you'd like.
